2020 Safety In Action Awards

Congratulations to IPSC's 2020 Outage Safety in Action (SIA) Award winners—**Aaron Mangelson, Brett Turner, Dave Fritzges, and Rod Moore!** Each of these recipients were nominated by fellow employees for demonstrating outstanding safety behavior during the 2020 Spring Outage. Their conscientious, safety-minded efforts are appreciated by all at IPSC.

Each SIA Award nomination required three specific reasons or examples demonstrating safe behavior and how and why a high value of safety was exhibited by each nominee. During the award recognition, each SIA Award winner was asked, "Why do you take the level of initiative you do in order to ensure work place safety?" Their responses are included below.

Aaron Mangelson

- Aaron is always safety minded and is looking at the big picture when planning a job.

- Brett has a positive attitude and is very approachable when workers have questions regarding equipment or asking for changes to be made that adjust equipment barriers.

Brett's response was because we all rely on each other and I feel we all need to do our part and take our responsibilities seriously.

Dave Fritzges

- Dave is very conscientious of his own safety and the safety of those around him. His example of proper PPE, willingness to offer help, and [willingness to] ask for help is appreciated.
- Dave is meticulous when he walks and verifies his clearance list prior to accepting a work authority.

- Dave serves on the Central Safety Committee and is good to point out safety hazards to those he works with.

Dave responded, *I want to help keep others and myself safe. We all need to watch each other's backs.*

Rod Moore

- Rod has consistently been safety conscious in all that he does.


